

WCAA Outstanding Performance Ellis Trophy

The Ellis trophy is awarded to the athlete who performs the most outstanding performance anywhere in the world during the year up to the end of September.

The performance could be in any discipline except endurance in which case it would be considered for the Warwickshire Endurance Trophy.

The winner is selected by the President of the Association who may, if s/he wishes, consult with others.

2020	Elliot Giles (Birchfield Harriers)	For his 800m in 1.44.56 in the Diamond League
2019	Lewis Byng (Stratford Upon Avon AC)	For his 8th place at the U20 European Championships in Borås Sweden. Lewis is now ranked 1st in the UK.
2018	Kare Adenegan (Coventry Godiva Harriers)	For her world record of 16.80 secs in the T34 100m Wheelchair event at the Anniversary Games in London in July.
2017	Andrew Pozzi (Stratford Upon Avon AC)	For winning 60m Hurdles Gold at the European Indoor Championships and 5th Semi Final 110m Hurdles World Champs.
2016	Kare Adenegan (Coventry Godiva Harriers)	For winning the Silver medal in Rio Paralympics 100m T34 (Cerebral Palsy – Wheelchair) Classification in 18.29
2015	Megan Beesley (Birchfield Harriers)	For her performances in the 400m Hurdles at the World Championships
2014	Rory Dwyer (Stratford Upon Avon AC)	For finishing second in the England U20 championships (as an U17) with a HJ of 2.16
2013	Sue Harrison (Leamington C and AC)	For her bronze medal placing in the European 100k championships in Belval, France.
2012	Andrew Pozzi (Stratford AC)	For his 4th place in the 60m hurdles in the World Indoor Champs in Istanbul
2011	Nathan Woodward (Tamworth AC)	For recording 48.71 for the 400m Hurdles and for reaching the IAAF World Championships in Daegu
2010	Sue Harrison (Leamington C and AC)	For winning the IAU 50k trophy in a new UK record time.
2009	Marlon Devonish (Coventry Godiva Harriers)	For his relay leg at the World Championships in Berlin.
